A Planting the Seed

This is the first in a series of family history novels which will follow the lives of one family over two hundred years. It's only the first book, and it's a very long one, but I got through it in just over a week. Two six-year-old brothers lose their parents and have to try to live on their own. An uncle comes to look after them, but he only wants to take them to his farm and make them work. We see how the boys' lives change because of what happens to them. In the end they both become very wealthy, but an argument about business ends their relationship. I can't wait to read the next one to find out what happens.

B Do You Really Want To Do That?

This fascinating novel is about a young teenager who keeps doing dangerous things like climbing on top of buildings and jumping off bridges into the river. It looks at why people might want to do such things and what this can do to people. The boy always gets good marks at school and appears to be a model student, but at night he lives a completely different life. When his parents are asleep, he creeps out of his house to do something dangerous. However, one night he sees something that changes his life forever. I can't tell you what because that would spoil the

story. But I strongly recommend you read this book if you love adventure and mystery.

As a teenager myself, I was able to identify with the protagonist, and with her problems and dilemmas. Without giving anything away, the plot also has some surprising twists and turns which will keep you reading late into the night.
