Zero conditional

Uses for real or true situation

Form: **If** + **present simple** + **present simple**

Example: **If he doesn't study, he doesn't pass**

First conditional

Uses to possible or probable situations

Form: **If** + **Present simple** + **Future**

Example: **If Andrew arrives late again, they will fire him**

Second conditional

Uses for Hypothetical situations

Form: **If** + **past simple** + **Would** + **verb**

Example: **If you won the lottery, you would travel the whole world**

1. Write if it is first, second or third conditional

- 1- If he tells the truth, they will forgive him
- 2- If you didn't watch so much television you would do better at school
- 3- If we leave now we may get there by two
- 4 - If children study, then their parents are happy
- 5- If doesn't study, he doesn't pass
