## Unit 2: Tell me a story

#### Narrative tenses

A narrative describes past events. We often use the past simple, the past continuous and the past perfect in a narrative.

### Past Simple

We use the past simple to describe the main events in a narrative. These are completed actions in the past.

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative	Short Answers
S + Verb + Complement Remember that the verbs in the past simple are <b>regular</b> or <b>irregular</b> . Regular verbs add — ed /-d and Irregular verbs change. Mike <b>opened</b> the door and <b>saw</b> a package on the floor.	Mike <b>didn't open</b> the door and <b>didn't see</b> a package on the floor.	What <b>did</b> Mike <b>open?</b>	Yes, he did. No, he didn't.

#### Past Continuous

We use the past continuous to describe the background events in a narrative.

One autumn afternoon, I was sitting in the kitchen.

We also use the past continuous to describe an action that was in progress when a completed action happened.

She was having breakfast when someone knocked the door.

We often use when and while to connect past events.

I was walking along the beach when I found a wallet.

While they were waiting for the bus, it started to rain.

## Past Perfect

We use the past perfect to describe an action that happened **before** another action in the past.

I called James at his office, but he had already gone home.

# They decided to go for a drive in Paul's new car. He **had bought** it only two days before.

Her upcoming trip to Australia is very exciting!
