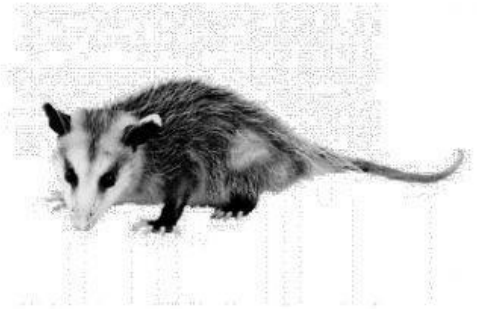

Here are some of the animals that make themselves stinky to protect themselves.

OPOSSUM

The opossum is related to the kangaroo. When the opossum feels scared, it lies down and plays dead. It will also make itself smell really bad, so other animals won't come close.



SKUNK

Skunks can also be stinky. When this black and white animal gets scared, it lifts up its tail and sprays a very stinky liquid. If the liquid lands on you, you will be stinky, too.



MILLIPEDES

Millipedes are long, skinny bugs with lots and lots of legs. When a millipede is scared, it will curl up into a ball and release a stinky liquid.
