

Time expressions + will

When we make predictions about the future with **will**, a **time expression** is necessary (next week, tomorrow, one day, soon, this summer, etc.).

when + will

After the time expression **when**, a present tense form is used, although this refers to future time.

- When you **get** to the station, I **will wait** for you outside.
