Despite the perceived benefits of increased mobile adoption in areas such as education, publics express concern about potential downsides of mobile phone use. The survey asked about six possible risks from mobile phone use, and respondents in every country are most concerned about children being exposed to immoral or harmful content. A median of 79% - including a majority in each country surveyed- feel people should be very concerned about this.

Meanwhile, the prospect of users losing their ability to communicate face-to- face is the item of least concern in each country. In only two countries (South Africa and Colombia) are a majority of adults very concerned about declined communication skills as a result of mobile phone usage.

Among these 11 countries, Colombians rank in the top two most-concerned about all of these issues. Other countries that rank in the top two most-concerned on particular issues include: Mexico (identity theft and online harassment); Jordan (phone addiction and impacts on children); South Africa (exposure to false information and losing the ability to talk face-to-face)
