

Notable Roman citizens from Hispania

Hispania was an important part of the Roman Empire and birthplace of many notable citizens.

Trajan was born in Italica, near Seville, in 53 AD and died in 117 AD. He was the first emperor from Hispania. He was emperor for 19 years between 98 and 117 AD. The Roman Empire reached its largest size under his rule. After his death he was succeeded by his cousin Hadrian, the second Roman Emperor from Hispania.

Hadrian was born in Italica in 76 AD and died in 138 AD. He was the second emperor from Hispania, succeeding his cousin Trajan. He was emperor for 20 years between 117 and 138 AD. He travelled a lot and visited every province of the Empire. He built the Hadrian's Wall, in the north of Britain to protect the Romans from the Celtic tribes in the north.

Seneca was born in Corduba in 4 BC and died in Rome in 65 AD. He was a philosopher, statesman and dramatist. He wrote many "books" and became an important figure in the Silver Age of Roman Literature.
