<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Verbs ending in –e lose this letter: 		
drive → driv <u>ing</u>	<i>I was driving beside the river when I saw a bear.</i>	
Hope → hop <u>ing</u>	<i>Mike was hoping to meet you last weekend.</i>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Verbs ending in consonant + vowel + consonant usually double the last letter: 		
begin → be <u>ginning</u>	<i>Women were beginning to wear shorter skirts in 1963.</i>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Verbs ending in –y, x or –w do not double the last letter: 		
pay → pa <u>ying</u>	<i>I was paying for the jeans when I heard the alarm.</i>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Verbs ending in –y; the final letter “y” is in the same place. 		
enjoy → enjoy <u>ing</u>	<i>She was enjoying her ice cream when her son arrived.</i>	
try → tr <u>y</u> ing	<i>I'm trying to speak in English all the time.</i>
