

Probability phrases: informal to formal.

What's the correct idea & better expression?

1. I'm totally sure the wedding will be on August twenty first.

1. The wedding will probably be on August twenty first.
2. The wedding may be on August twenty first.
3. The wedding will definitely be on August twenty first.

2. I'm not really sure I'll get the job.

1. It seems unlikely that I'll get the job.
2. I'll definitely get the job.
3. I probably won't get the job.

A. There's no way that Ken will arrive by noon.

- A. Ken may not arrive by noon.
- B. Ken probably won't arrive by noon.
- C. There's no chance Ken will arrive by noon.

B. Maybe Ana will pass the course.

- A. It's possible Ana will pass the course.
- B. Ana will definitely pass the course.
- C. It seems unlikely Ana will pass the course.
