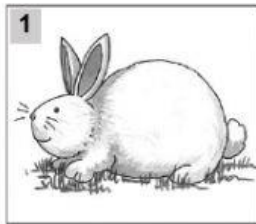

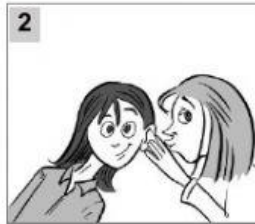

The Sixth Sense

According to Aristotle, one of the brightest philosophers in history, people have got five senses. However, modern science is more advanced than ancient philosophy and researchers have now identified 22 different senses. Proprioception is one of these senses. Some people call it the "sixth sense".

Proprioception is the sensation of knowing where our body parts are without seeing them move. About 5-10% of people suffer from sensory problems. Their movements aren't as accurate as the movements of others because they can't always sense what they are doing. For example, people with bad proprioception might fall off a chair because they aren't sure where they are sitting. Thankfully, there are exercises to improve proprioception.

Ian Waterman lost his proprioception one day. Although he could feel and move his body, he didn't have the ability to control it. Ian was determined to recover.
