UNSOLVED MARITIME MYSTERY

You may have heard about ships mysteriously going missing at sea. Even with modern forms of investigation there are still things that haven't been fully explained. Here is just one of those mysteries that defy rational explanation.

Katz II

In 2007, a 12-metre catamaran boat, Katz II, was discovered without its crew members just off the coast of Queensland in Australia. On the yacht had been owner and experienced sailor Derek Batten. He had been joined by his neighbours, brothers Peter and James Tunstead.

The yacht, which left the port on the Sunday, was spotted again the next Wednesday. When the maritime police boarded the boat, they found everything was laid out as if the crew were still on board. Two things soon became apparent: firstly, there can't have been a struggle as the yacht was in good working condition, and lifejackets were still on the boat.

Secondly, it must have happened unexpectedly: the boat's engine was still running, a laptop was on, the radio and GPS system were working and a meal had been prepared and left behind untouched. The only signs that were out of the ordinary was one of the sails was damaged.

To this day, no one knows what happened. The crew were never found, but there are many theories about what could have happened. The police think that a fishing line could have got caught in the boat's rudder and that as one of the men tried to free the boat, he fell overboard. The other two men may have drowned trying to save him.

Others say the crew might have experienced sudden difficulties during rough weather and gone overboard. Some people say the yacht could have come into contact with another boat and the men were forced off their boat.

Whatever the truth, this story is sure to go down as one of those great mysteries in maritime history.
