

We use the PRESENT SIMPLE to describe:	Time expressions:
A habits and routines	• adverbs of frequency (always, usually, hardly ever)
B permanent situations	• every day/week/month etc.
C current states	• on Mondays, Fridays etc.
D general truths	• in the morning/evening etc.
E schedules and timetables (with present and future meaning)	• at night, at the weekend etc.
