

let someone (v.)

💡 We use "let" when we say it's OK for a person to do something they want to do.



Gina's dad will let her buy the piano.
(v.)

(Gina wants to buy the piano.)

make someone (v.)

💡 We use "make" when we tell a person to do something they don't want to do.



Terry's mom made him wash his hands.
(v.)

(Terry didn't want to wash his hands, but he had to do it.)
