Cheese rolling, Cooper's Hill, Gloucestershire

This strange festival involves people rolling cheeses down a hill. Some people believe that the tradition started more than two thousand years ago by the Phoenicians, who once lived in south-western parts of Britain before 54BC. Some people say that it was an old winter festival which represented the birth of the New Year. In those days burning bushes were rolled down the hill and not cheese. But the true origin escapes us in the twenty-first century. The first written evidence of it was in 1826, although it was obvious that the tradition had been going on for many years before that.

Cooper's Hill is a small village in rural England where, once a year, people throw themselves down the very steep hill running after a 3.6 kg cheese. By the time the cheese reaches the bottom of the hill it is travelling up to 70 miles per hour. The first person to get to the bottom of the hill wins the cheese. There are different races during the day for both men and women. At the bottom of the hill, strong people are waiting to catch them before they run, fall or roll into the bushes and fence at the bottom.

It can be a very dangerous festival as the people can easily fall at great speed and have to be taken to hospital. In addition, spectators can also get hurt. In 1997 about seven spectators were hurt as well as around 30 runners. But this doesn't seem to stop the enthusiasm for the race as people from around the world come to participate in this strange tradition. In fact, as a result of some injuries caused by the hard cheese, it has now been replaced by a copy made out of foam so that it cannot hurt anyone. Strangely enough, the event seems to be very popular in Japan as there are usually a few Japanese TV companies covering the race.
