## How to express quantity? (4)





a little

- a small quantity, not much
- with uncountable nouns only

Ex : She didn't eat, but she drank a little water.

I can speak a little German.

a few

- a small amount, not many
- with countable nouns only

Ex : Sorry, I only have a few <u>cookies</u> left.

I only speak a few <u>words</u> of German.



little

- almost nothing, nearly no
- with uncountable nouns only

Ex : We need to go shopping, there's little food.

Dan is skinny because he eats very little.

for

- not many, not enough
- with countable nouns only

Ex: They only have few photos on Instagram.
You're good!You make very few mistakes
