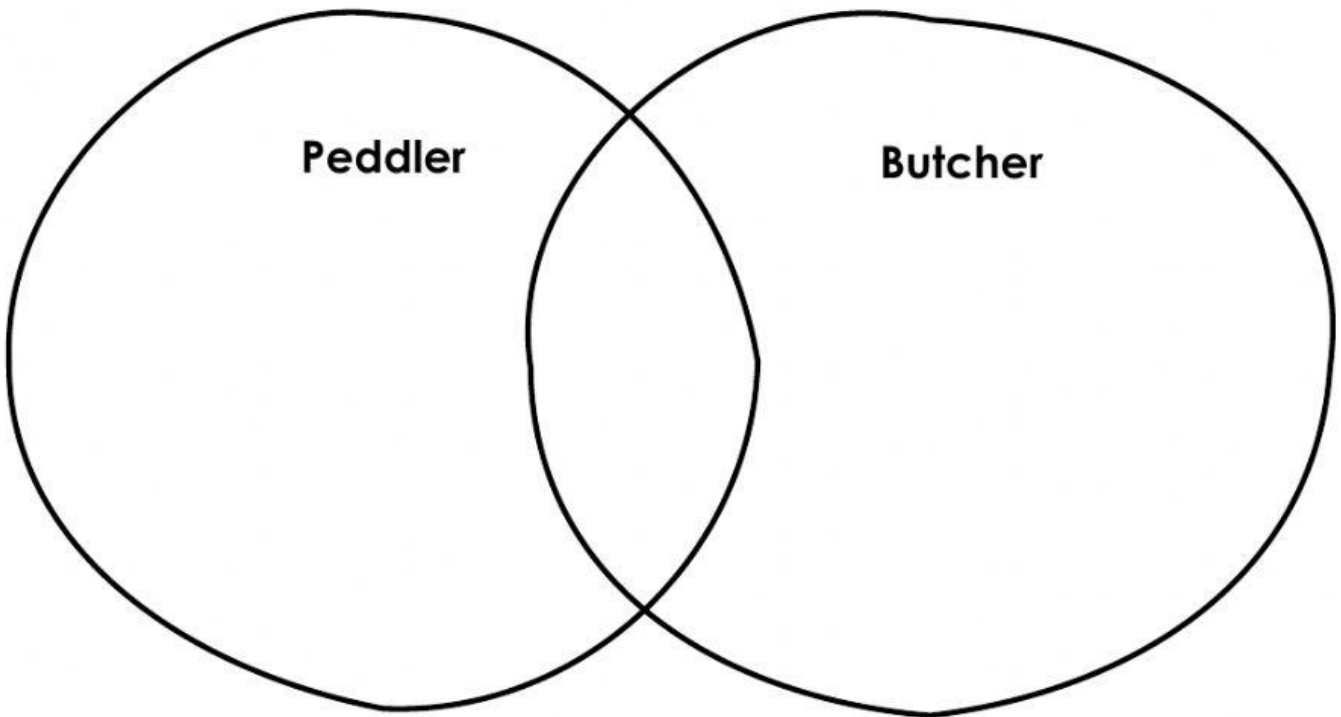
1. An intelligent person. This character asked the people from the town for help to make a stone soup.
