

NOUN CLAUSES

change into a noun clause!

Noun clauses can be used as a subject or an object.

Examples:

What Jane said was true. (S)
I heard what Jane said. (obj)

Words that can introduce a noun clause:

- question words (when, who...)
- whether, if
- that

Question words can be followed by infinitives:

I don't know what I should say
I don't know what to say
