Birthdays around the world

Everybody has a birthday. Many children in other countries **celebrate** their birthdays like children in the United States. They have a birthday cake, gifts, and sometimes a birthday party for friends. Friends and family **gather around** a table with a birthday cake on it. They sing 'Happy birthday to you.' Two American sisters wrote this song in 1893, but people still sing this song 5 today! The birthday cake usually has lighted candle on it, one candle for each year of your life. The birthday child makes a wish and then blows out all the candles. If the child blows out the candles in one **breath**, the wish will come true. Other countries have different **customs**.

In Norway, Denmark, and Sweden, people fly the country's **flag** outside their home to tell everyone that someone in the family is having a birthday. In Denmark, a parent puts gifts around a child's bed when the child is sleeping at night. When the child wakes up in the morning, the gifts will be the first thing the child sees. In Sweden and also in Finland, the birthday child gets breakfast in bed!

In some countries, some years are more important than others. In Holland, these are 5, 10, 15, 20, and 21. They call them 'crown' years. On a crown birthday, the birthday child gets a much more important gift. The family also decorates the child's chair at dining table with flowers, paper, and balloons. The special years in Japan are 3, 5, and 7. These are the **lucky** years. On November 15 every year, there is a festival called 'Seven, five, three' when the children and their families go to a religious place. Then the family gives a party for the child and gives the child gifts. Because of religious reasons, Hindu children only get to celebrate their 25 birthdays until the age of sixteen.

Birthday cakes around the world come in different sizes and **flavors**. There are even ice cream birthday cakes today. In China, there is no birthday cake. Friends and family go out to lunch, and to wish the birthday child a long life they eat noodles.

Venice : A Changing city

Many people think Venice is one of the most beautiful city in the world. This **unique** city is in the north of Italy. It is really a group of 118 small islands. These islands have canals to separate them and 400 **bridges** to join them. There are no cars in Venice – just boats. Everything must come to the city by boat and then be carried over the bridges to people's homes and shops.

Venice is a city on the water, but it has a problem with high tide. This is a new problem. For about 60 days a year, parts of the city are covered in water. **Residents** know this well. As soon as they hear the sound of the emergency **alarm**, they put on their **boots** or walk on special platforms..

Venice is beautiful, old, and **romantic**. But it is changing. Just 30 years ago, 120,000 people live there. Today, Venice has half that number. The residents are moving out, but more tourists are visiting all the time. Venice has over 20 million tourists every year! That is both good and bad.

Tourists bring money. But they also bring change. The old shops that sold products like fruit and vegetables to the residents are changing to souvenir shops because the **rent** on the old shops is too high. Old houses in the center of the city are changing to hotels. The residents of Venice are moving out there are few houses, and they are too expensive. Only rich people, mainly from other countries, or **elderly** people who own houses passed down from their family can live in Venice.

In the past, Venice's biggest problem was the high water. Now it is the number of tourists. The city is working on both of these problems. They want residents and tourists to enjoy this beautiful, old, and romantic city for all time.
