Kōrero - Speak

'Kia ora' literally means 'be well,' but it commonly means **'hello.'** 'Tēnā koe' literally means 'you are there' or 'I acknowledge you there.' It commonly means **'greetings.'** 'Tēnā koe' is more formal than 'kia ora.'
