

Household Chemical Labels

By law, household chemicals that may hurt you must have a warning label on them.

The warning will be in big, bold letters. Most warning logos use red and black to make them stand out. Some may use bright yellow.

Sometimes chemicals can be put in other bottles or containers without labels. If you are unsure of what is inside a bottle or container, do not open it and ask an adult for help.

Chemicals can be found in the kitchen, bathroom, laundry and garage.

Harmful chemicals include:

- cleaning products like (bleach and soap)
- medicines
- weed killer
- rat bait, snail bait and fly spray
- paint
- turpentine or methylated spirits
- cigarettes and alcohol
- pool chemicals

Some words that will tell you if the item may be harmful to you include:

- **Dangerous**
- **Poison**
- **Caution**
- **Warning**
