A New Drinks Business

Kara Goldin had enjoyed diet cola for many years. She thought that if she was buying drinks without any sugar in them, she was making the correct choice for her health. However, in 2001, she started to notice that drinking three litres of diet drinks daily was making her feel exhausted, giving her spots, and she was putting on weight. She contacted the manager from her previous job at Google and told him about her business idea. He bought some bottles of Hint for his employees and it was so popular that Google began to fill their fridges with it regularly.
