

Question: How did the woman in the room die?

Degree	Example sentence	Comment
FACT	She had a pink raincoat.	The speaker is 100% sure. This is a fact.
Almost 100% Sure	She <b>must have</b> come from Cardiff. She <b>must have</b> been at a hotel.	The speaker is making a logical conclusion and is almost sure (but not completely sure) that the woman came from Cardiff.
Possibility	She <b>may have</b> died from poisoning. She <b>might have</b> choked. She <b>could have been</b> strangled.	The speaker is simply mentioning a possibility here. All three examples in the first column are ways of saying "It's possible that died from different causes."

Degree	Example sentence	Comment
FACT	She was a reporter.	The speaker is she is in media.
Impossible	She <b>couldn't have</b> been shot.	The speaker believes that it was impossible that someone killed her by shooting her.
Almost 100% Sure	She <b>must not have</b> been from the area.	The speaker is making a logical conclusion. The speaker is 95% sure the woman was not from London.
Possibility	She <b>may not have</b> had one lover. She <b>might not have</b> killed herself.	The speaker is simply mentioning a possibility here.
