Independence Day

Independence Day is a public holiday. It is a day off for the general population and most businesses are closed. The Ukrainian flag is seen outdoors on this day. Independence Day in Ukraine is a big celebration that sees parades and crowds of people in Ukrainian traditional clothes. Other Independence Day events may include:

- Fireworks
- Outdoor exhibitions
- Concerts
- Free public markets
- Sporting events

There are two main symbols of Ukraine - trident (tryzub) and flag. The national flag consists of two equally sized horizontal strips of blue and yellow color. Blue color symbolizes the sky and yellow color symbolizes wheat on Ukrainian lands.

Ukrainian tryzub is golden trident that comes from Kyiv Rus. There are many different versions what does this symbol mean. Some people believe it has encrypted a word "ВОЛЯ" - freedom and some people think it is a symbol of Christian Trinity.

In 1991 about 90% (percent) of Ukrainians voted for their country's independence and on August 24th 1991 it was declared. This year most of celebrations are cancelled because of war. Russia wants to break the spirit of Ukrainian people, but they are fighting for their freedom and independence now. When Ukraine will win the war we will have spectacular celebration.
