We use the present continuous to talk about something that is happening




now

verb





When the verb ends in **-e**, we drop
the **-e** and add **-ing**.

hide **e** + **ing** = hiding

ride **e** + **ing** = riding



When the verb ends with a vowel and
a consonant (swim), we sometimes
double the consonant and add **-ing**.

swim + **ing** = swimming

run + **ing** = running


