something that is happening

now

am
is are

verb

ing





When the verb ends in **-e**, we drop
the **-e** and add **-ing**.

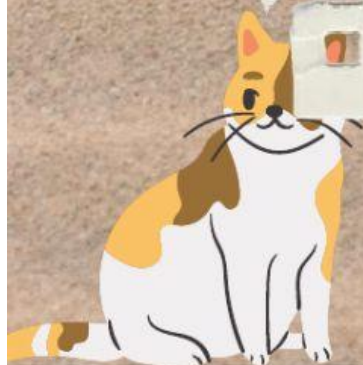
hide**e** + **ing** = hiding

ride**e** + **ing** = riding

When the verb ends with a vowel and
a consonant (sw**im**), we sometimes
double the consonant and add **-ing**.

sw**im** + **ing** = sw**im**ming

ru**n** + **ing** = ru**nn**ing
