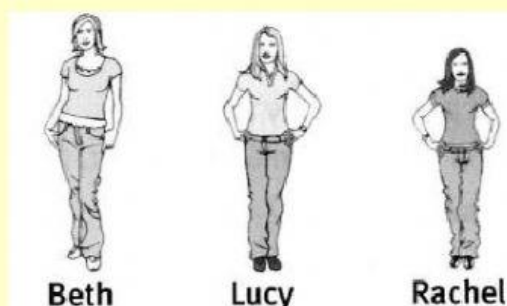


COMPARATIVE OR SUPERLATIVE?

Your camera's more expensive than mine.	This camera is the most expensive in the shop.

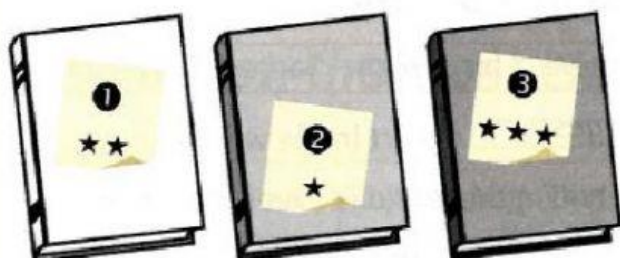
