If + past perfect (never occurred/impossible situation)

Would + present perfect (the consequence)

-If I **had studied**, I **would have passed** the test

With comma

Without comma

Could
should

-I'd have passed the test **if I had studied**

-If I had a studied,

{ I **could/should have passed** the test

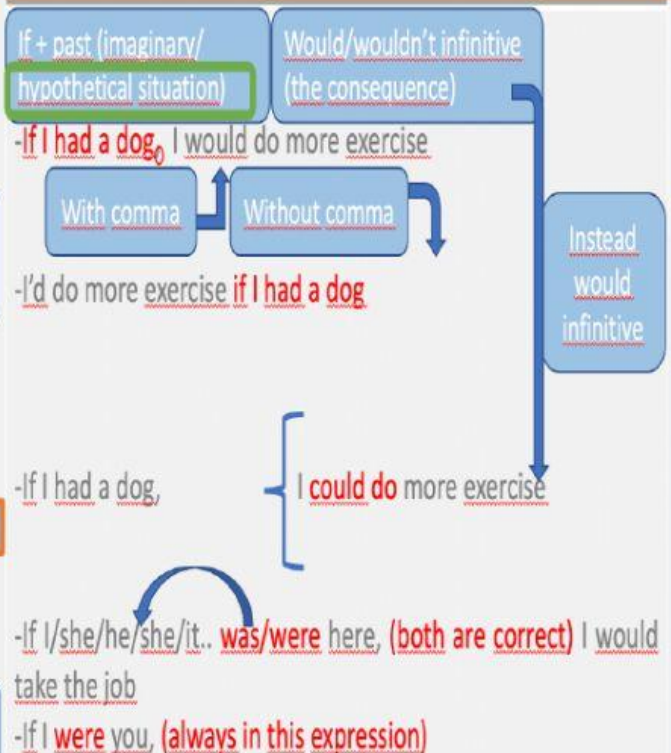

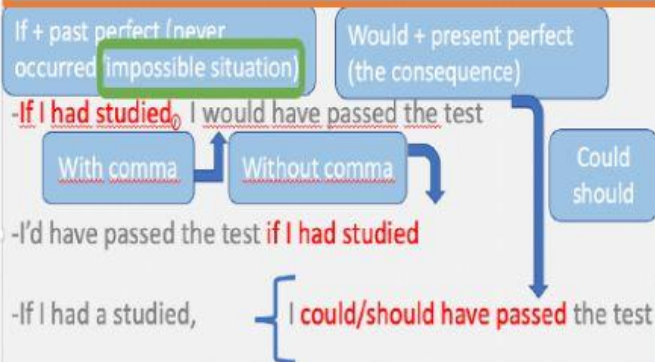
FIRST CONDITIONAL - USES
