Possessive adjectives tell us about who owns something or how two people are related.

Possessive adjectives come before a noun and replace **the, a** or **an**.

That is my pencil. [ownership]

Here is her car. [ownership]

His sister lives in Sur. [relationship]

Is Fatma your sister? [relationship]
