

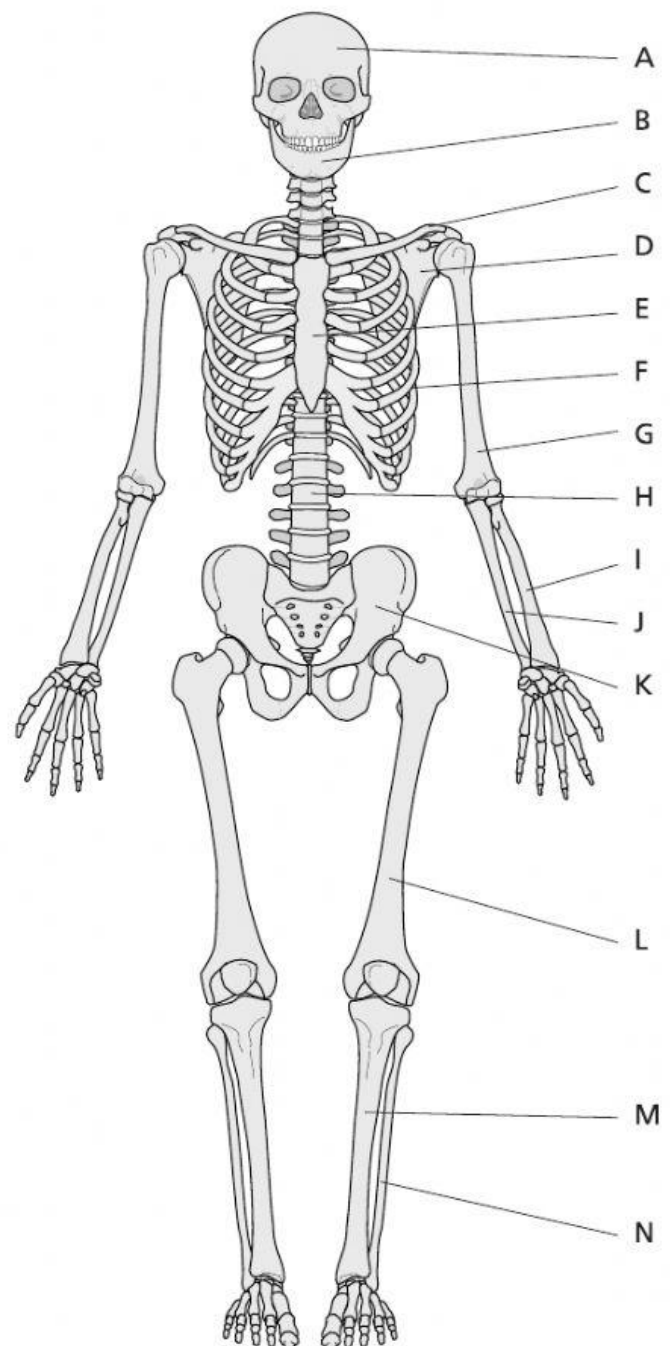

Bones meet at joints; without these the skeleton would be rigid.
Blood cells are made in bone marrow, and marrow is found in the middle of some bones.
Animals without a skeleton cannot hold themselves up.
Some bones are shaped to fit around an organ, such as the skull and ribcage.
