This is important: at first, you _____ write everything using hangul. You can use what we call romanization, Korean words written with the Latin alphabet. However, you _____ use romanization after one or two months of learning Korean: that's going to be a huge problem for you, because romanization doesn't exactly match the Korean alphabet to perfection.

You _____ practice not only your Korean writing, but also your pronunciation. You _____ to sound like a native, but with time, your Korean pronunciation will become better.

Particles are also a very important part of Korean language. They show what words are subjects, verbs, objects and have many other functions. You _____ learn how to use particles correctly because they're part of Korean grammar.

Another thing: hierarchy is very important in Korean language. Verbs and words change when you speak to an older person, to your boss and to people who are higher than you in hierarchy. You _____ use the wrong verbs and words: it can cause a lot of stress and humiliation!
