They do think it is rude to take the last piece of food from a serving dish for yourself. They offer it to another person instead. That is very polite. When your bowl is empty, someone gives you more food. When you are full, you put your hand over your bowl or leave some food in your bowl. They don't put chopsticks on top of their bowls. They put them on the table next to them when they finish eating. They don't use napkins, but they usually clean their hands with hot towels at the end of the meal.
