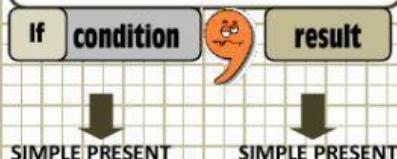

## ZERO CONDITIONAL: FACTUAL OR REAL CONDITIONAL

I Read the information carefully about the zero conditional. Then do the following tasks:

### EXAMPLE

If you boil water, it evaporates.



### GENERAL TRUTHS

If you mix red and blue, you get purple.

### INSTRUCTIONS

If you press the button, the TV turns on.

### HABITS/DAILY ROUTINES

If I drink, I never drive.

### SCIENTIFIC FACT

If you heat ice, it melts.

### WHEN

We can also use when instead of if, for example:

**When I get up late I miss my bus.**
