

MODAL VERBS



Grammar tip: Modals are used to modify the tonality of a sentence. Can indicates ability, Could indicates possibility. Should indicates recommendation, Must indicates obligation. Would indicates a desire.

Structure: (+) Subject + modal + verb

(-) Subject + modal + not + verb.

Negatives with not or n't: would not, wouldn't / could not, couldn't / should not, shouldn't

(?) Modal + subject + verb?

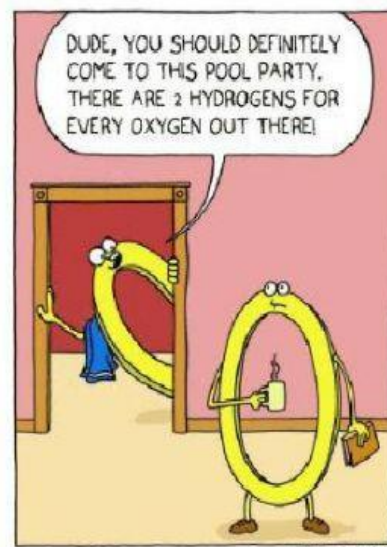
