MATERIAL EXPLANATION

Main Idea, Topic Sentence and Supporting Details in Analytical Exposition Text

1. Main Idea

a. Definition

Main Idea is the **root** of a text. A main idea is a **sentence** that states what that essay or article talks about. The main idea sets up **the rest** of the article and is included in the introduction or first paragraph.

b. Form

The Main Idea is a **full sentence**, not a word or phrase. Or, Main Idea is a sentence which at least has **Subject and Predicate** in it. For example:

- "Smoking kills people"
- "Littering is a bad habit"

c. How to find it?

Generally we can find Main Idea in the **first paragraph** of a text (but not always). Or, we just need to ask ourselves about "**What does the Author want to point out?**", so the answer will bring you to the Main Idea.

2. Topic Sentence

a. Definition

Topic Sentence is the first sentence in every Argument Paragraph, after the Thesis. The Topic Sentence is used to **support the Main Idea** above. So, the Topic Sentence should always support or correlate with the Main Idea.

b. Form

Same with Main Idea, Topic Sentence is also a **full sentence**, not word or phrase.

c. How to find it?

In Analytical Exposition, Topic Sentences lie in every Arguments Paragraphs (after Thesis). It is usually the **first sentence** in Argument Paragraph, but not always.

d. How to make it?

Simply, we can make the Topic Sentence by asking "**WHY?**" about the Main Idea.

3. Supporting Details

a. Definition

Supporting Details are the most component which construct the Argument Paragraph in Analytical Exposition. Supporting Details contain **specific explanation** which guide us to a full understanding of the Main Idea. They clarify, describe, explain, expand and illustrate the Main Idea and Topic Sentence in any further.

b. Form

Supporting Details are the **group of sentences** in Argument Paragraph, which mostly construct the paragraph itself.

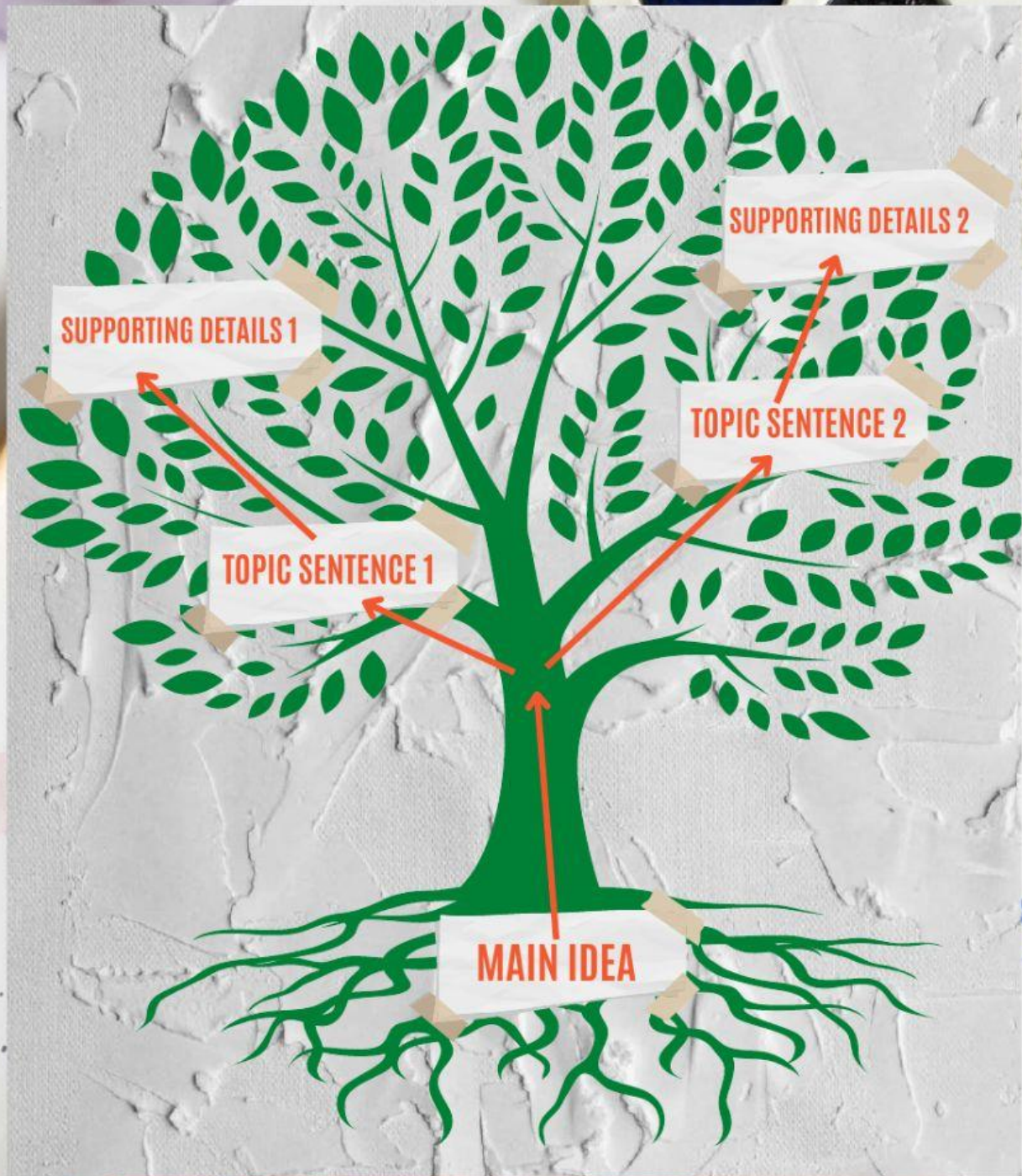
c. How to find it?

They come **after the Topic Sentence** in Argument Paragraph and have correlation with the Topic Sentence itself.

d. How to make it?

Simply, we can make Supporting Details by asking "**WHO or HOW?**" about the Topic Sentence.

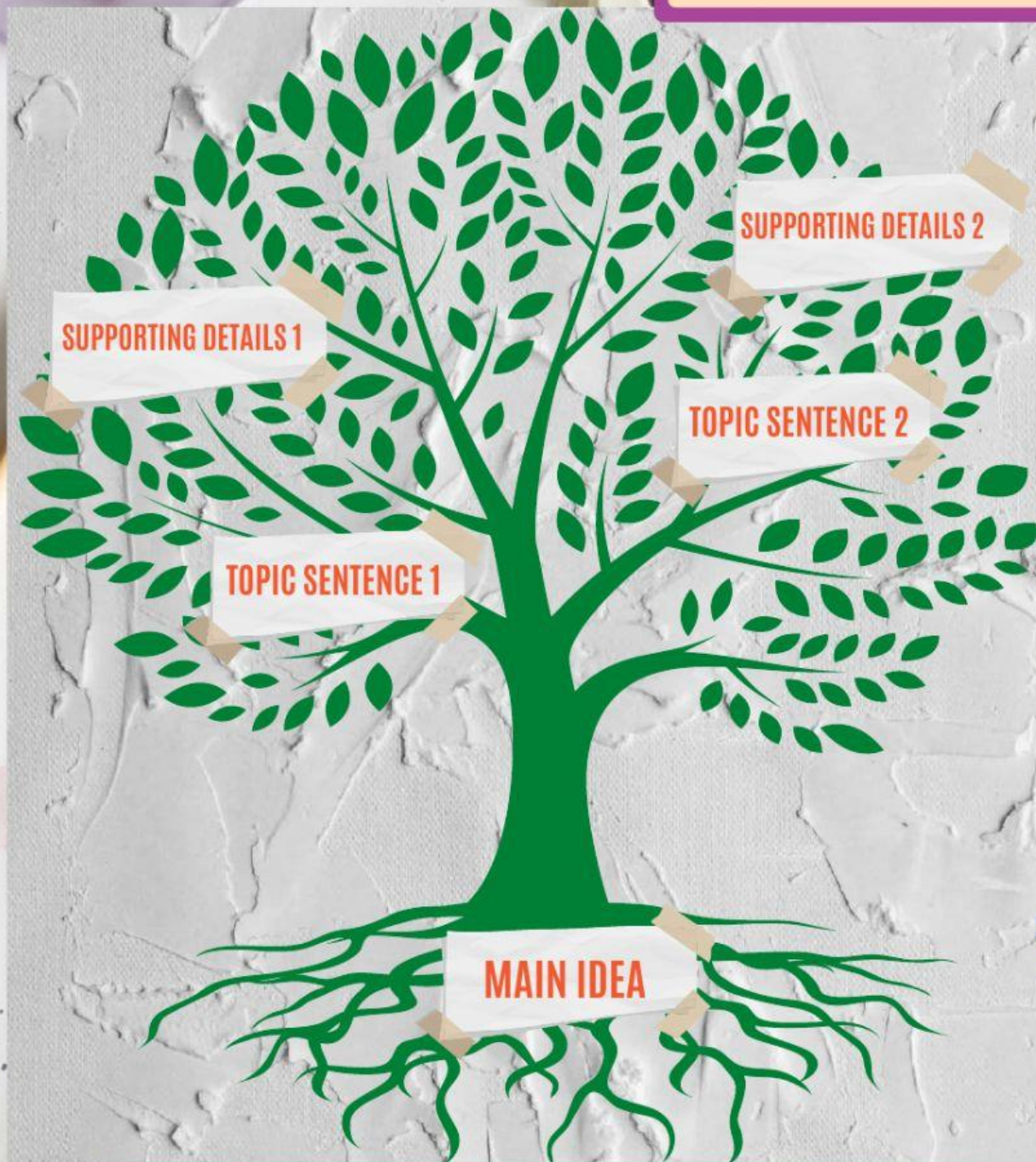
TREE ILLUSTRATION

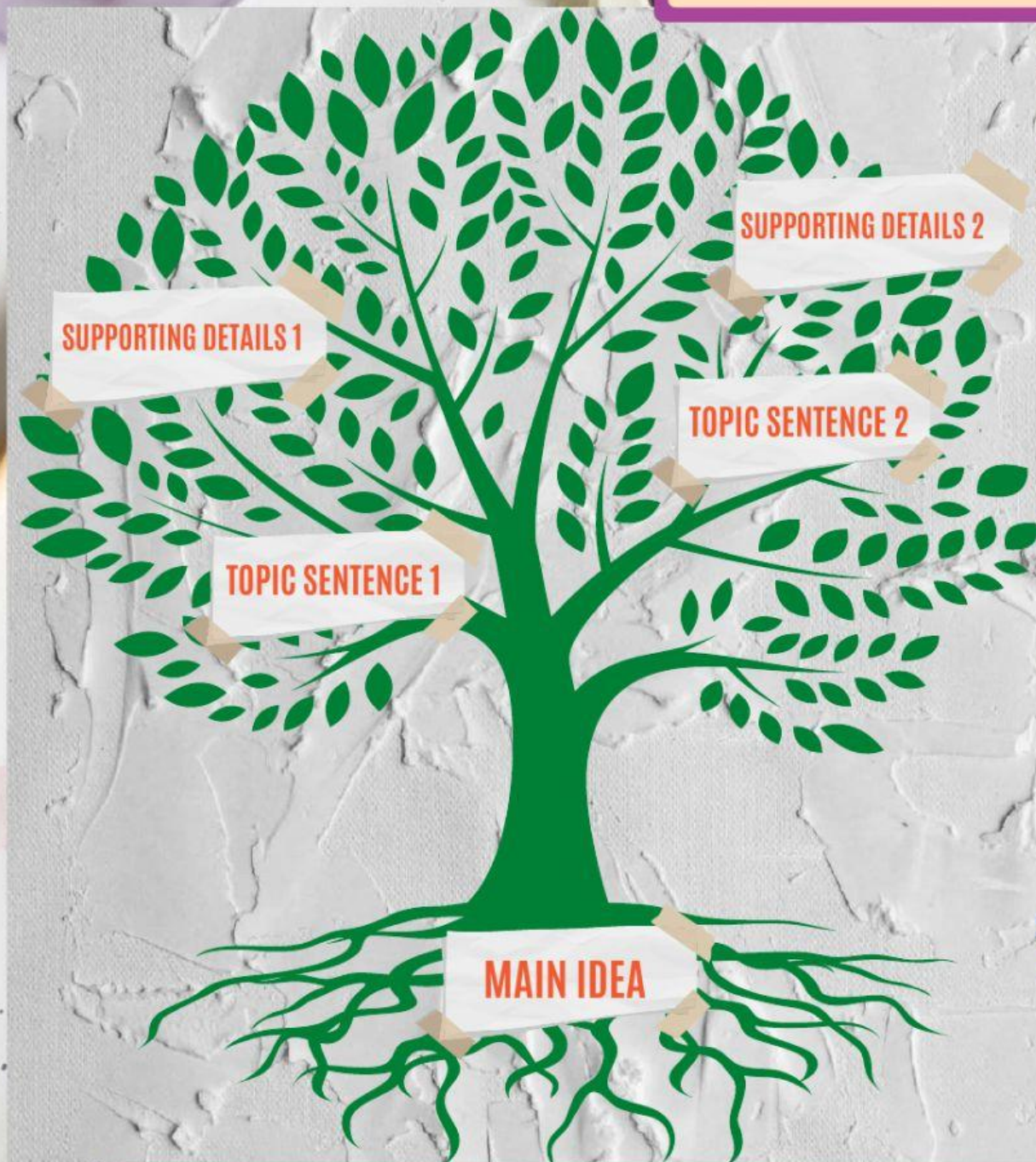
