What is this story based on?		Loire River.
What are Dupin's critiques of the newspaper's conclusions?		Accuses news of sensationalism. Newspapers said that the bodies need 6 days to surface. paper disputes whether it is Marie Roget. -Details to refute claim: there is no differentiation between a body that drowns and a body going into the water already dead... the body wasn't taken directly to the morgue which makes their evidence less credible.
Marie Roget was known as		A gang was seen nearby.
Why do the police think multiple people killed her?		Poe. Dupin is a made-up character Poe is a natural person using a fictional parallel account to try and solve a genuine case.
One of the newspapers argues that it must be a gang. They tore off a part of their coat to strangle her because they did not have a handkerchief. What was the argument for this being incorrect?		Hudson River.
The story is serialized... explain.		"The Perfume Girl"
What does Dupin conclude about the clothing found?		The sensationalized murder of Mary Rogers.
What is the name of the river where the body of Mary Rogers was found?		That she has a secret lover that she keeps running off with.
What is the name of the river where the body of Marie Roget was found?		Dupin argues that all gangs have handkerchiefs because they pretend to be proper so it could not have been a gang.
How did Marie Roget die?		Murdered.
Why is the story unsuccessful according to Aydelotte?		He concludes that the clothes should have been found right away and that the timing isn't right. It seems like they had been left there as clues.
Who does this story target?		Newspaper rather than police.
How is this different from The Murders in the Rue Morgue?		No solution, human suspect, no investigation (instead rely on newspaper).
Who is the narrator and why does he identify himself?		Dupin is close to solving the murder because Poe thinks he figured it out - the abortion story comes out and suddenly there is a more probable solution than the one he discovered in fiction, so Marie Roget has a completely different ending than Mary Rogers's case.
Marie Roget has disappeared before - what does Dupin hypothesize?		Murders present an ordered world... we construct order... there is no killer, no conclusion to establish right in the world, and no scapegoat...the length of the story is also very long, does not follow a narrative structure, and has contradictions... we do not like to see all the dead ends of the police.
