Verbos regulares		
	Forma base	Past Simple
En la mayoría de los verbos se añade -ed a la forma base.	<i>jump</i> <i>kick</i>	<i>jumped</i> <i>kicked</i>
Los terminados en e muda: solo se añade -d .	<i>dance</i>	<i>danced</i>
Los de 1 sílaba, terminados en vocal + consonante que no sea w, x o y : se dobla la última consonante antes de añadir -ed .	<i>stop</i> <i>plan</i>	<i>stopped</i> <i>planned</i>
Los de 2 sílabas, con el acento en la última: se dobla la última consonante antes de añadir -ed .	<i>prefer</i> <i>permit</i>	<i>preferred</i> <i>permitted</i>
Los terminados en l : se dobla la l antes de añadir -ed .	<i>travel</i>	<i>travelled</i>
Los terminados en consonante + y : se cambia la y por una i antes de añadir -ed .	<i>try</i> <i>study</i>	<i>tried</i> <i>studied</i>



I didn't talk.	Did I talk?	Yes, he did. / No, he didn't.
You didn't talk.	Did you talk?	Yes, we did. / No, we didn't.
He didn't talk.	Did he talk?	➔ <i>Grammar Appendix, Workbook, page 104</i>
She didn't talk.	Did she talk?	
It didn't talk.	Did it talk?	
We didn't talk.	Did we talk?	
You didn't talk.	Did you talk?	
They didn't talk.	Did they talk?
