2. Let's (1) play football (2) today at about four (3) in our yard, don't we? (4)
3. Where can I (1) buy some (2) oil? I'm seeing (3) a shop over there. Do you think I can buy it there? (4)
4. She has never brought to us (1) any (2) presents. Even when she visited us (3) on the birthdays. (4)
5. We didn't invite the Browns, (1) but all they (2) came to our birthday party, and I could say (3) I was a bit surprised to see (4) them at the door.
6. Now I am not surprised, that Helen looks so beautiful (1). But a hour (2) ago we didn't know (3) that it could be possible. (4)
