VERB + (VERB) -ING like = gustar love = amar dislike = no gustar hate = odiar enjoy = disfrutar	I like going to the park. They love playing football. She dislikes talking in public. He hates watching horror movies. You enjoy reading comics.
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I / you / we / they You (you/Evelyn and you) we (my friend and me) they (the banks / the cats/ the students)	he / she / it he (my father/John/the student) she (Sheila/My sister/my best friend) it (the bank/ the cat)
+) 😊 subject + verb simple form + rest of the sentence. We love playing football.	+) 😊 subject + verb -s + rest of the sentence. He loves playing football.
DO	DOES
-) 😞 subject + do not + verb. s.f. + rest. They don't love playing football.	-) 😞 subject + does not + verb s.f. + rest. He doesn't love playing football.
?) Do 😊 + verb s.f. + rest ? Do you love playing football? Yes, I do. / No, I don't.	?) Does + 😊 + verb s.f. + rest ? Does she love playing football? Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.

ADDING -ING TO THE VERBS.

1. Add -ing

work – working play – playing enjoy – enjoying see - seeing
think – thinking jump – jumping cry- crying fly – flying

2. Verbs ending with -e. Eliminate e and add -ing.

decide – deciding write – writing note – noting

3. When a verb ends with a consonant + vowel + consonant, double the consonant, except v,w,x,y,z.

swim – swimming plan + planning

4. Verbs ending with “ie” change to -ying.

die = dying lie = lying tie - tying
