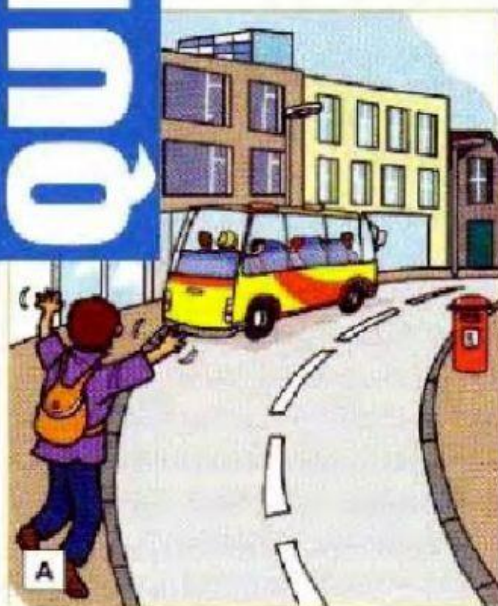

## Second conditional: if clause with 'd (would)/wouldn't

### Statements

If the lift **got** stuck, I'd **bang** on the door.  
I'd **bang** on the door if the lift **got** stuck.  
If the lift **got** stuck, I **wouldn't** do anything.

### Questions and short answers

What **would** you **do** if you **broke** a glass?  
Would you **tell** anyone?  
Yes, I **would**./No, I **wouldn't**.

### Note

**be** in the second conditional

After *I, he, she* or *it*, we can use *was* or *were*.

*Were* is more formal than *was*.

*If I was/were in a broken lift, I'd be frightened.*

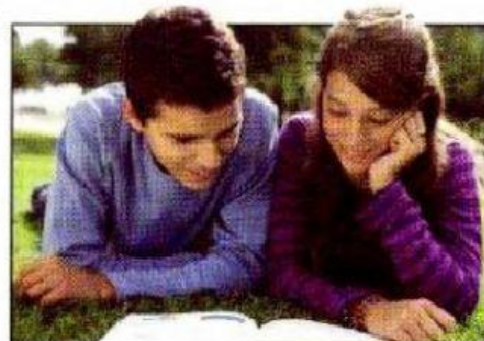
