

Helpful Phrases

the usual stuff

☞ meaning: something that one did quite often
example: She said she was tired of doing **the usual stuff**, and wanted to try something different.

such a chore

☞ meaning: something that involved a lot of effort and was unpleasant
example: She hated washing the dishes because it was **such a chore**.

some reason

☞ meaning: an excuse (that might not be very good)
example: He managed to find **some reason** to get away from the place.

a wave of inspiration washed over ...

☞ meaning: shows that one suddenly felt very interested and confident about doing something
example: Suddenly, **a wave of inspiration washed over** Mary, and she crafted a beautiful necklace from seashells.

it would be fabulous

☞ meaning: shows that something was wonderful
example: She said **it would be fabulous** if she could go on a cruise all by herself.

... very own

- meaning: something that one could say belonged to him/her
example: Finally, she had her **very own** room, where she could sleep peacefully.

to ... delight

- meaning: shows that one was feeling very happy about something
example: **To** his **delight**, he found a golden coin under the chest.

pondered over the problem

- meaning: thought about how to get over some difficulty
example: He **pondered over the problem** for three days before he finally found a solution.

an idea hit ... from out of the blue

- meaning: shows that one suddenly thought of a very good plan
example: Just when she thought that she would have to give up, **an idea hit** her **from out of the blue**.

a neat little pile

- meaning: a small, tidy heap
example: He swept the leaves into **a neat little pile** before putting them into the garbage bag.

give ... a little help

☞ meaning: to help (someone)

example: The kind man decided to **give** the boy **a little help** to encourage him to finish the puzzle.

topped ... with ...

☞ meaning: placed something on top of (something else)

example: The waitress took out a lovely peach pie and **topped** it **with** fresh whipped cream and some strawberries before taking it to the customer.

dug into ...

☞ meaning: ate with a good appetite

example: The hungry boys **dug into** their food as soon as they sat down.
