John Glenn was a pilot. In 1959, he started training as an astronaut for NASA. NASA trained him because they needed a man to go into space and go around the Earth. Three years later, John Glenn got on the Mercury spaceship called *Friendship 7* and became the first American to go around the Earth. He spent five hours in space and went around the Earth three times. This journey helped NASA learn a lot of new things about space.

In 1998, Glenn travelled into space a second time. This time the spaceship was called *Discovery* and it stayed in space for nine days and went around the Earth 134 times. At the age of 77, he was the oldest man to travel into space. He is a hero for all Americans.
