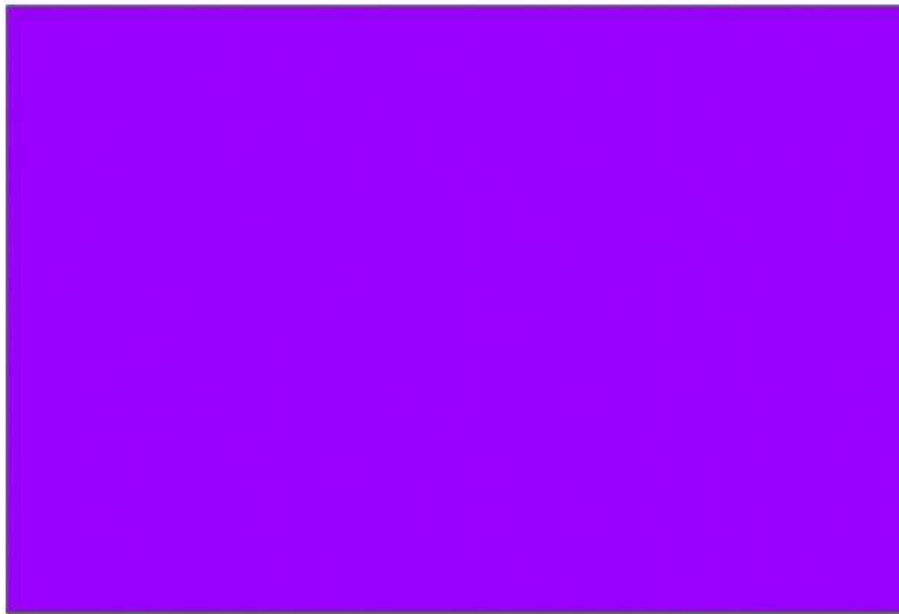

GUSTAR – TO BE PLEASING (TO LIKE)

(A mí)

Me gusta – I like

(A ti)

Te gusta – you like

(A él, A ella, A Ud.) Le gusta – he/she likes

When using the 3rd person form (he/she) you must always use a clarifier. A clarifier tells the reader or listener exactly who you are talking about. When you want to say a certain person just add an **A** in front of the name. (A Billy...)

e.g. He likes to read
