



The small intestine is an essential part of a digestive system. It is 6 meters long. Food enters the small intestine from the stomach, but it's still too big to be absorbed by the rest of the body. The small intestine breaks the food down even further. But it doesn't do it alone. It needs juices to do this, which it gets from the pancreas and liver. Sometimes your food can spend as long as 4 hours there, until it becomes a thin, watery mixture. Then the nutrients are small enough to pass into the blood, ready to be taken to other parts of your body.
