If- Clause Type II**Second Conditional: unreal possibility or dream**

The **Second Conditional** can be used to talk about what you would generally do in imaginary situations.

Form: Second conditional

if clause	main clause
Past Simple	would + infinitive
If I <u>bought</u> a pony last year, If I <u>were</u> rich, If she <u>had</u> enough money, If he <u>didn't take</u> BTS yesterday,	I <i>would ride</i> it every day. I'd <i>travel</i> around the world. she <i>would buy</i> a new house. he'd <i>arrive</i> his office very fast.

EXCEPTION If I were ...

In the Present Unreal Conditional, the form "was" is not considered grammatically correct. In written English or in testing situations, you should always use "were." However, in everyday conversation, "was" is often used.

Examples:

- If he **were** French, he would live in Paris.
- If she **were** rich, she would buy a yacht.
- I would play basketball if I **were** taller.
