REMEMBER

IF	CONDITION	RESULT
	PRESENT SIMPLE	WILL / WON'T + BASE FORM VERB (without TO)
If	he studies hard,	he will pass the exam.

RESULT	IF	CONDITION
WILL / WON'T + BASE FORM VERB (without TO)		PRESENT SIMPLE
He will pass the exam	if	he studies hard.

We use the first conditional when there is a real possibility that the condition will happen in the future.

 **DON'T FORGET** the **-S** or **-ES** for the **3rd person singular** (present simple affirmative).

E.g. If it rains, we won't go to the park.
