

# THIRD CONDITIONAL (IMPOSSIBLE)

## REMEMBER

IF	CONDITION	RESULT
	<b>PAST PERFECT</b>	<b>WOULD / WOULDN'T HAVE+ PAST PARTICIPLE</b>
<b>If</b>	<b>he had won the lottery,</b>	<b>he would have travelled around the world.</b>

RESULT	IF	CONDITION
<b>WOULD / WOULDN'T HAVE+ PAST PARTICIPLE</b>		<b>PAST PERFECT</b>
<b>He would have travelled around the world</b>	<b>if</b>	<b>he had won the lottery.</b>

We use the third conditional **for impossible situations** as we use it to talk about the **past** and to **imagine** the result of this situation or imagine a **different result** of it.

⚠ DON'T FORGET **past participle** (regular verbs **-ed**, irregular verbs **3<sup>rd</sup> column**).
