	PAST PERFECT	WOULD / WOULDN'T HAVE+ PAST PARTICIPLE
If	he had won the lottery,	he would have travelled around the world.

RESULT	IF	CONDITION
WOULD / WOULDN'T HAVE+ PAST PARTICIPLE		PAST PERFECT
He would have travelled around the world	if	he had won the lottery.

We use the third conditional **for impossible situations** as we use it to talk about the **past** and to **imagine** the result of this situation or imagine a **different result** of it.

! DON'T FORGET **past participle** (regular verbs **-ed**, irregular verbs **3rd column**).
