AFFIRMATIVE

Subject + verb in past form

REGULAR VERBS + -d/-ed/-ied 2^o column

IRREGULAR VERBS 2^o column

Examples:

I played hide and seek

They went home

USE: To talk about finished actions in the past

NEGATIVE

Subject + **didn't** + verb in infinitive (base form)

Indicates

past tense negative form

Examples:

She didn't read the book

They didn't go to the market

Grammar: Past Simple

INTERROGATIVE

Did + Subject + verb in infinitive (base form)

Indicates

past tense interrogative form

Examples:

Did she do the homework?

Did you like the film?

IMPORTANT

In questions we change the word order

verb "to Be"



Person	AFFIRMATIVE FORM	NEGATIVE FORM	INTERROG. FORM
I	was	wasn't	Was...?
YOU	were	weren't	Were...?
HE, SHE, IT	was	wasn't	Was...?
WE	were	weren't	Were...?
YOU	were	weren't	Were...?
THEY	were	weren't	Were...?

Past time expressions

USE: We use these expressions to talk about something that happened in the past

last	Friday/week/month/year	I watched a good film <u>last Sunday</u>
ago	after a period of time	We went to London <u>three years ago</u>
yesterday	morning/afternoon/evening	I emailed her <u>yesterday evening</u>

Time expressions can go at the **beginning** or **end** of a sentence

Last week, I played in a concert I played in a concert last week
