Grammar Note!!!

We usually add *-er* and *-est* to **one-syllable words** to make comparatives and superlatives:

small - smaller- the smallest

If an adjective **ends in -e**, we add *-r* or *-st*:

large - larger - the largest

If an adjective **ends in a vowel and a consonant**, we double the consonant:

big - bigger- the biggest

If an adjective **ends in a consonant and -y**, we change *-y* to *-i* and add *-er* or *-est*:

dirty- dirtier - the dirtiest

We use *more* and *most* to make comparatives and superlatives for most two-syllable adjectives for all adjectives with three or more syllables:

friendly - more friendly - the most friendly

The adjectives **good**, **bad** and **far** have irregular comparatives and superlatives:

good- better- the best

bad- worse - the worst

far- further/farther- the furthest/farthest

little - less- the least
