Winchester's Hat Fair

Winchester, one of England's smallest and oldest cities, is normally home to 40,000 residents and offers just a few historic architectural attractions for visitors. However, for one weekend every July, crowds of nearly 70,000 visitors suddenly appear for the annual Hat Fair.

The festival was set up in 1974 with just a few acts. Over forty years later, it's now the UK's longest-running celebration of street theatre. The event attracts international performers and has inspired Britain's only outdoor performing arts degree at a local college. Unlike most modern performance events, there are no theatre buildings, entrance fees, or queues for tickets. Instead, the artists perform outdoors and the audience sits on the ground. At the end, people in the audience decide how much money to give the performers. They put money into a hat to pay for the show, giving the festival its name.

Visitors come to enjoy an impressive variety of talented performers, from comedians to circus acrobats. The event gets bigger every year and now regularly hosts world premieres of unique new shows. Find out more at www.hatfair.co.uk!


